Lake Wailes Trail Improvements – RTP Grant

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF LAKE WALES, POLK COUNTY, FLORIDA, COMMITTING THE CITY TO AMEND ITS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PROGRAM TO ALLOCATE FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS IN PARKS IMPACT FEES IN FISCAL YEAR 12/13 FOR THE "PARK IMPROVEMENTS – KIWANIS PARK" PROJECT AND TO ADD A PROJECT ENTITLED "LAKE WAILES TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS" ALLOCATING TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS IN CITY FUNDS.

WHEREAS, the Recreational Trails Grant Program of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection provides funding for trails, trailside facilities, and trailhead parking areas; and

WHEREAS, the Lake Wailes Trail needs to be resurfaced and the trailhead parking facilities need to be expanded to accommodate increased use; and

WHEREAS, matching funds are required for application to the Recreational Trails Grant Program; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKE WALES, POLK COUNTY, FLORIDA:

The City Commission commits to amending its Capital Improvements Program as follows:

- 1. Project entitled "Park Improvements Kiwanis Park" Amend to use up to \$40,000 in impact fees for parking expansion and trail head improvements in Fiscal Year 2012/2013.
- 2. Add a capital item entitled "Lake Wailes Trail Improvements" with funds of \$20,000 in Fiscal Year 2012/2013 to be funded by the City through operating revenues, sidewalk replacement funds, and up to \$10,000 in parks impact fees for eligible items.

THIS RESOLUTION WAS INTRODUCED AND PASSED by the City Commission of the City of Lake Wales, Florida, at its regular meeting on March 20, 2012.

Nature of Statement and Information Disclosed

This is a statement of fiscal impact has been performed as required by and in accordance with Section 2-802, Article VIII of the City of Lake Wales Code of Ordinances. It is a statement solely for the purpose of analyzing and reporting the fiscal impact on the City of either applying or not applying for this grant, using certain assumptions as indicated herein. General Assumptions

A fiscal impact statement constitutes a forward-looking statement on the acceptance of grant funds and the proper execution of all requirements as set forth in any grant application, agreement, covenants attached to real or tangible property, or other duly enforceable stipulations. In order to produce such a statement, assumptions about future events and conditions must be made.

In any case where a reasonable expectation of a future condition or event has been disclosed or is already known to Finance Department personnel, that information has been used as an Assumption in the fiscal impact statement. Expectations not known or not considered reasonably expected to occur have been excluded from the fiscal impact statement. If an event or condition may occur which would have a material and *direct* fiscal impact, but is not reasonably expected to occur, it is disclosed in the fiscal impact statement.

General Assumptions are made in this fiscal impact statement that the City Staff executing the grant program already possess the required knowledge and expertise to expertly perform all of the requirements of the grant, and that the information provided to prepare this impact statement is true and correct. It is also assumed that no outside events will create a positive or negative influence on the grant program, and that there will be no changes in the legal, operational, or economic environment in which the grant program, and the City as whole, operates, except as disclosed herein.
